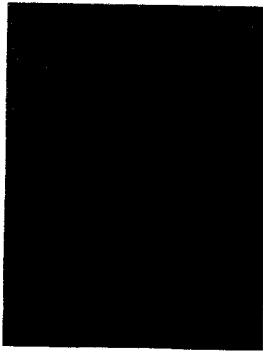


Richard E. Deuser (1928 - 2015)


